

Math and English Placement for 2012-2013 School Year

Middle School Math

Hill-Murray School's math department has a traditional curriculum that offers Pre-Algebra to seventh graders and Algebra I to eighth graders.

For incoming seventh graders: a Pre-Algebra fundamentals exam is offered for students who wish to be considered for Algebra I. Students who do not take the exam or those who do not pass the exam will be placed in Pre-Algebra. **Please bring a copy of student's most recent report card and two #2 pencils- no calculator.**

For incoming eighth graders: an Algebra I fundamentals exam is offered for students who have had a full year of Algebra I and wish to be considered for a class other than Algebra I. Students who do not take the exam or those who do not pass the exam will be placed in Algebra I. **Please bring a copy of student's most recent report card and two #2 pencils and a non-graphing calculator.**

Ninth Grade Math

Hill-Murray School's math department has a traditional curriculum that the majority of ninth graders begin in Intermediate Algebra I. **A math exam is offered for students who have had a full year of Algebra I and wish to be considered for a class other than Intermediate Algebra I. Students who do not take the exam or those who do not pass the exam will be placed in Intermediate Algebra I. Please bring a copy of student's most recent report card and two #2 pencils and a non-graphing calculator.**

Ninth Grade English

An Honors English exam is offered for those incoming 9th graders who wish to be considered for Honors English 9. Students who do not take the exam or those that do not pass the Honors English exam will be placed in English 9. **Please bring a copy of student's most recent report card and two #2 pencils.**

The Hill-Murray English Department has developed a ninth grade Honors English class that challenges students to go beyond the expectations of the regular curriculum. Students have the opportunity for in-depth examination of literature including rigorous studies of Shakespeare, fiction, poetry, and writing. In addition to the challenging course work, students will participate in class discussions and individual and group class presentations.
