1. In order for a student to earn a letter they must meet all eligibility requirements as described in the Hill-Murray School student handbook.
2. The student must be an active member of the band who has demonstrated a consistent commitment to musical excellence.
3. In addition to the above, a total of **40** points must be earned in **at least three different categories** to complete the requirement for lettering in band.

- ___ Excellent Rating at Regional Solo/Ensemble or Large Group Contest: 8pts
- ___ Good Rating at Regional Solo/Ensemble or Large Group Contest: 6pts
- ___ Member of an Honor Band or Auditioned Based Ensemble such as GTCYS, MYSO, and UM Honor Band: 10pts
- ___ Member of the All-Conference Band: 10pts
- ___ Member of the Pit Orchestra for Theatre: 10pts
- ___ Participation in a Summer Music Camp: 10pts
- ___ Participation in a Hill-Murray theatre production (other than Pit Orchestra) 5pts
- ___ Private Lessons for the year on band instrument (prior approval required): 10pts
- ___ Private Lesson for the year on a non-band instrument (i.e. Guitar, Piano, Voice): 5pts
- ___ Non-school sponsored performance (prior approval required): 2pts per event
- ___ Serving as a Band Board Member (prior approval required): 10pts
- ___ Serving as a Committee Chair: 10pts per event
- ___ Performing at Pep Band events above and beyond requirements: 2pts per event over the required amount
- ___ Participation in the Marching Band: 10pts
- ___ Participation in the Jazz Band: 10pts
- ___ Band Service: 3 pts per hour of service.
- ___ Other large group performing events (such as the Cathedral Cornerstone): 10pts per performance
